- 2 separate issue charges approved by the MRC
 - Underperformance Risk Management in RPM/CP approved in December 2015
 - Address the concern that the current Capacity Performance rules may not provide adequate options to manage the risk of underperformance during Capacity Performance compliance hour(s)
 - External Capacity Performance Enhancements approved in May 2016
 - Address the operational, markets and planning challenges associated with the integration of external Capacity Performance resources in PJM
- Solutions to be implemented prior to the 2020/2021 Base Residual Auction




- Purpose of the poll was to quantify support for the various options and packages for the External Capacity Performance Enhancements Matrix

1. Do you think the cost of Ongoing External upgrades should be included in the External Region Planning Process?





3. Do you support further discussion of whether External Resources should be modeled in LDAs other than Rest of RTO?



4. Do you support including External Resources in non-RTO wide PAH Assessments if they were needed by PJM dispatch to resolve an issue in an area smaller than the RTO?



5. Do you support PJM's methodology to determine Electrical Distance?



Question 6 – Congestion Management Cost Allocation


6. Do you support allocating the costs associated with congestion management to the external resource owner if FFEs are not allocated to the resource?

7. Do you support requiring external Balancing Authorities to commit to transfer FFEs/FFLs to the attaining Balancing Authority by the start of the Delivery Year?




8. Do you support requiring existing pseudo tied resources to obtain unit-specific transmission service for future delivery years from the External Balancing Authorities?


9. Do you support Package A?


10. Do you support Package B?


11. Do you support Package C?
