

Maximum Emergency temporary change extension

Issue Source

To address concerns with fuel and emissions that have emerged in recent months, PJM made a temporary change to M-13 Section 6.4 in the 'Note' to modify the remaining hours under which a resource may be offered as Maximum Emergency Generation. This 'Note' has an expiration date of 4/1 but needs to be extended to allow PJM and stakeholders additional time to work on a more permanent solution.

Issue Content

As part of the quick fix process, PJM is requesting the MRC approve an extension to the expiration date on the 'Note' to allow PJM and stakeholders additional time to work on a more permanent solution. PJM is also requesting to make a clarification to the Note to replace 'reliability' needs with specific reasons a resource should not be offered as Max Emergency.
