



PJM-NYISO JOA Update

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- PJM and NYISO have their own respective procedures in determining Interconnection Reliability Operating Limits (IROLs)
- The PJM-NY Interface was considered as IROL by NYISO but not by PJM
- A recent joint study* by PJM and NYISO concluded the PJM-NY Interface does not meet the IROL criteria of NYISO. NYISO has decided to remove the PJM-NY Interface as being an IROL.

The NYISO-PJM Joint Operating Agreement (JOA) is being updated to reflect the recent NYISO change.

35.5.9 New York - PJM IROL Interface(s)

The Parties ~~share a joint IROL related transfers related to the interconnecting transmission lines between their respective Reliability Coordinator Areas and Balancing Authority Areas. This IROL is adhered to~~ will adhere to IROLs that each Party develops in accordance with its respective procedures.¹ ~~in order~~ IROLs will be determined as needed to maintain acceptable steady-state and transient performance of the NYISO and PJM Transmission Systems. Each Party will specify the list of IROL Interfaces in its procedures.² Both Parties will monitor ~~this limit~~ these limits in accordance with this Agreement and independently determine the applicable import and export transfer limits.

- **M2M Redispatch Flowgate** shall mean Flowgates where constraints are jointly monitored and coordinated as defined and set forth in Schedule D to this Agreement
- **Other Coordinated Flowgate** shall mean a Flowgate where constraints are jointly monitored and coordinated as defined and set forth in Schedule D to this Agreement.

- **M2M Redispatch Flowgate** shall mean Flowgates where constraints are jointly monitored and coordinated as defined and set forth in Schedule D to this Agreement
- **Other Coordinated Flowgate** shall mean a Flowgate where constraints are jointly monitored and coordinated as defined and set forth in Schedule D to this Agreement. No re-dispatch settlement will occur on Other Coordinated Flowgates.
 - No change to current JOA requirement or Schedule D (M2M Redispatch).

- Schedule A under section 35.21 includes a listing of PJM-NYISO Interconnected Facilities that requires periodic review
- Facility List will be removed from JOA to simplify periodic review
- Facility List will move to external posting on PJM and NYISO public websites

NYISO and PJM shall jointly develop and maintain a ‘PJM – NYISO Interconnection Facilities List’ (including a description of the facilities and metering points) and post the most current mutually agreed upon list on their respective public websites. The Parties may jointly revise the list by mutual written agreement. After the Parties mutually agree to changes, NYISO and PJM shall post an updated list on their respective websites. Neither Party shall knowingly post a list that includes changes that are not the product of mutual agreement.
